"From the cradle to the grave" is an expression heard many times I'm sure, but do we know where the saying came from?

Churchill, the leader of the Conservative Party, coined the phrase 'from the **Cradle to the Grave'** in a radio broadcast in March 1943 to describe the need for some form of social insurance to give security to every class of citizen in the state.

The food bank can be considered such security for many people, indeed during these past few weeks we have seen both the beginning and end to life. We have been supporting a terminally ill lady and her daughter, sadly the lady has now passed away. We have heard from the daughter that the care shown to both her Mum and herself, by adding a few little extra items in the deliveries during an especially difficult time, were appreciated and her Mum felt we really cared for her as a person and felt she wasn't just a number.

At the beginning of life there can be difficult times too and we have also been able to help and support a family in such a time. When baby arrives early and needs extra care in the neonatal unit in hospital it can be an expensive time for parents. Fuel costs for travelling to hospital daily to check on the new born taking essential items plus parking fees put an extra strain of already limited finances and we again are pleased to be able to help.

Two different families and two different situations but certainly opposite ends of time here on earth!


KITCHEN PACKS!
